Preventing introduction of non-native species into Ogasawara Islands

Ogasawara Islands have never been connected to any continent, therefore, species living on the islands have evolved independently and constitute a unique ecosystem that is the reason for the inscription of World Natural Heritage. However, those ecosystems are very vulnerable and once non-native species are introduced and settled, it will have a huge impact on the ecosystem. In addition, it will take a large amount of money and time for taking measures and it is very difficult to eradicate them. Thus, it is very important not to bring non-native species into Ogasawara Islands in order to protect the fragile ecosystem.

Things we can do to protect the nature of Ogasawara

No introduction of non-native species

Please do not bring in plants, animals, soils, and seedlings with soil that may spread to Ogasawara from other areas.



Do not spread nonnative species

When you go for a hike or visit other island, please check for seeds and small creatures attached to or hidden in your bags, clothes, shoe soles, and kayaks/ships.

Clean your shoe soles before going out.
